Building and Grounds

I decided to just list individual problems we had with the building throughout the summer. Actually, it went pretty smoothly except for a major water leak.

1. 2 toilets in Nursery were running continually. Replaced valve assemblies
2. Dawn to dusk bulbs were installed outside our garage and at double door on nursery building to hopefully deter burglaries
3. No air conditioning in main building...100-degree days of August! Fortunately, the repairman was able to get them running within 24 hours. There was a bad fuse in one unit, a capacitor in another, and wasp nests in both, blocking air flow! The kiddos and staff are required to wear masks, so they were pretty uncomfortable one day.
4. Electrician hired to replace several ballasts
5. The most troublesome issue was a major water leak under the concrete slab in the nursery bath/maintenance area. We were able to get a plumber to work many hours jack hammering the floor and repairing the 60 yr. old water lines...he even worked on the 4th of July! We have no idea how long the water had been leaking. The building was designed with catch areas under the concrete so it didn't come into the building. Denise just happened to hear it running one night after hours.
6. Air conditioning again not working later in August. They were able to repair with less difficulty
7. Sewer pipe leaking into basement
8. Emergency lights not working (the inspector thinks it is just batteries)
